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What has the impact of preceptorship been on you personally?

The preceptorship programme helped me to relieve the anxiety about the new clinical setting. Though I was a nurse with 15 years of experience, the preceptorship training given by the trust, from day one to day five, made me a competent nurse within the department and helped me to deliver a quality, safe and standard nursing care.

Personally, I would not have come to know about certain things in depth if they had not been taught in the preceptorship programme. For instance, safeguarding, the Mental Capacity Act, Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards, sepsis, falls, organisational outcomes and delegation, practice supervisor training, and most importantly preparation for interview training helped me to achieve Band 6 within the trust.

Advice for a new preceptee?

- Always treat your patients and fellow colleagues with respect.
- In all your actions, keep your patient safe and document your action promptly.
- Be a competent nurse by attending the preceptorship programme and the training given by the trust.
